





The Green Spine will be a new park and pedestrian-friendly route through the Church Street area. It will link Lisson Gardens, Broadley Gardens, Church Street, the new Luton Street development, Fisherton Estate and Orange Park. Benefits include:

- Flexible, community focused outdoor space that can be used for a range of activities.
- A pleasant, tree-lined route for pedestrians that also works well for cyclists and vehicles.
- Planting that encourages biodiversity and provides sustainable urban drainage.
- Accessible spaces for all age groups and those with disabilities.
- A safer environment during day and night-time through well-planned landscaping and lighting.
- Opportunities for new public art.
- Play spaces for all ages along the length of the Green Spine.



We have carried out three rounds of public consultation which received positive feedback and confirmation that more street trees, more open spaces, fewer cars, more green areas and kickabout space would be well received. People also asked for:

- Play space for all ages.
- Space to play football.
- Additional seating for parents in Broadley Street gardens.

Timeline

Works start on site early in 2021 and will last for 12-18 months. The work will be undertaken in phases to keep disruption to a minimum and to ensure there is always some park space available to use.
